Goals

To provide evidence-based HIV, Hepatitis C and Sexually Transmitted Infection education and culturally based Harm reduction education with the intent of increasing the knowledge and perception of STBBI's in rural populations.

We aim to increase knowledge and the uptake of prevention measures among the populations we engage with.



What is the Know Your Status program?

The Know Your Status (KYS) Program delivers education to central and south communities on Sexually Transmitted Blood Borne Infections (STBBI's).

The target population for this program are Indigenous people, People who use drugs, youth and people who are living in or were recently released from correctional facilities.

STC's Know Your Status Team consists of:

Program Coordinator – responsible for program activities and resource development

Outreach Workers – responsible for bringing the programming to rural communities.

Peer Network – allow people living with HIV to connect with various supports through someone with lived experience.

Community Partnerships – Provides us with access to different groups of people who could use our education.

We achieve the program objectives by:

The KYS team travels bringing presentations, booths, activities and resources to all ages and groups.

Providing presentations in rural communities.

Webinars sessions.

Providing educational resources.

Evidence-based practice within the Harm reduction and STBBI information in Canada.

Program quality improvement through questionnaires, evaluations and data collection.

Provide referrals as appropriate.

Support activities to improve testing in communities.

Support communities in capacity building.

Reducing the stigma of HIV and other sexually transmitted infections through education awareness.

Making new connections with rural communities and partnering in events related to STBBI. education/testing.
